Morgan Three-Wheeler Opening Run in England

Back in April Tom and I traveled to England for the Morgan Three Wheeler Club (MTWC) Opening Run—the 2012 Prescott Bike Festival and Hill Climb. As members of the club we are able to borrow the Gerald Carr car, a 1937 Morgan F4, when we travel to England. The English are just what you would expect: kind, thoughtful, and fun people.

Richard Williams, keeper of the Gerald Carr car, was nice enough to deliver the F4 to the Abbey Hotel in Malvern on Saturday, and he squeezed himself in the back seat for the ride back to his place. What a sight the three of us must have been. Then we had a chance to go for a drive through the Malvern Hills. It was a treat to drive a car that was made for these roads. She ran like a top, and we were grinning from ear to ear. Our illustrious MTWC president Brian Clutterbuck and Richard met us on Sunday morning, and we caravanned over to the event.

We arrived at "the Hill" to see about 30-35 three-wheelers already in attendance—30 more than we have ever seen in one place—and they kept on coming, one more unique than the next for a total of about 60 cars. Tom was occupied, taking it all in like a kid in a candy store. It rained on and off throughout the day, but our club members are resilient (see accompanying photo) and stayed 'til about 3:30 PM. Then skies cleared for our caravan home. Returning the Gerald Carr car to Richard's garage was bittersweet, but we had the Morgan Factory tour to look forward to the next morning. Then it was off to the pub for a few pints and to reminisce about the day.

We were the only Morgan owners on the tour that Monday, strange after spending



This weekend I finally got all of the bug splats off my Spitfire from the great Lewes, DE weekend adventure. After a lot of suspension and brake work that I had finished the night before, my "test drive" was to the Cape May-Lewes Ferry—probably not the best idea—but I made it without any hiccups. I can't say enough about how much fun it was to get away to historic Lewes with a nice group of PEDCers. I hope we can plan more overnight trips so more members can join in the merriment.

When we pulled into the show site, the grounds of the Lewes Historical Society, I noticed that the parking guides all had "noodles." I immediately asked if they were members of The Noodliers' Union. Before they could have me taken away I explained that the PEDC has been using the noodles for a few years now, and we have created a whole culture around them. It turns out our show host, the British Car Club of Delaware (BCCD), has been using noodles for about 10 years (and they did not seem interested in forming a Noodlier Lewes Chapter.)

I noticed that the BCCD used some judging criteria that are different from what we use at our shows. First, except for the featured marque, the Triumph Spitfire, entries were classed by year. This seemed a bit odd to me. For example, Minis were being judged alongside Jaguars and Rolls Royces. We will not be looking to adopt this scheme; however they did have a Premier Class—cars that had won first place in their class two or more years in a row—and also had two retired cars that won the Premier Class two years in a row and were no longer being judged at the show. Road Trip: "The Gathering" in Dobson, SC

Once a year in mid-April the hills near Dobson, SC come alive with the sound of raspy exhausts as British sports cars from hundreds of miles around convene for the Annual British Sports Car Gathering hosted by the Triumph Club of the Carolinas. And if I can possibly arrange it, I join them. Why drive 1200 miles round trip for a car show? Well, The Gathering isn't just another car show; it's a three-day event with road rallies, an auction, the show itself, a barbeque banquet afterwards, and, to top it all off, an autocross. In addition to that, the drive down there through the Virginia hill country along the spine of the Blue Ridge Mountains, at a time when the entire landscape is in bloom and fragrant, is simply sublime. There is no better way to kick off the driving season than a trip to The Gathering.

Taking the Scenic Route

My route down would take two days, giving me time to get off the interstates and take slower, more scenic roads, including the Skyline Drive and the Blue Ridge Parkway. Unfortunately there is no scenic route out of NJ, and the first few hours of the drive are the least scenic of all, spent on I-195, the Turnpike, and I-95 through Baltimore. From there I headed west on I-70 to stay well clear of Washington, DC and the traffic that always exists there. At Frederick I turned Southwest onto US 340, and the surroundings finally became pretty. Crossing into the Virginias near Harpers Ferry, US 340 takes you all the way to Front Royal, the start of the Skyline Drive.

The Skyline is one of America's most scenic and heavily traveled

byways, running through Shenandoah National Park. Normally it costs you \$10 to get in, but not on a Thursday in mid-April. As I approached the station at the entrance to the Park, I was greeted not by a smiling ranger but by a sign that said, "Please pay on your way out." Sixty-five miles and a little under two hours later, after filling up on the scenery and wanting to get to my hotel before dark, I turned onto the exit ramp for US 33 and passed another unmanned outpost simply marked "Closed." Try that in July.

The town of Waynesboro, VA stands near milepost 0 of the Blue Ridge Parkway, which makes it a convenient stopover for travelers like me. With a full tank of gas and about 200 miles to go, I turned right onto another of America's iconic roads. The beauty of doing a trip like this in early spring is you can have the road almost all to yourself. It can be 15 minutes between sightings of another car heading in the opposite direction, and a halfhour before you find yourself stuck behind anyone else. Although the posted speed limit is only 45, when traffic is this light it's easy to find yourself a littleand at times rather a lot—over the limit. Enforcement no doubt tightens up as the weather warms and traffic increases, but for now, it could best be described as "sparse."

Arriving in Dobson

Dobson is a small town in a rural area of green fields and rolling hills just a few miles off the Parkway and perhaps 15 miles from Winston-Salem. The host hotel, just off I-77, was buzzing with activity as cars arrived to

register and others departed on the rally. Having spent all day on the road, I wasn't hot to climb back in the saddle again, so I settled instead on washing 600 miles of bugs and dirt off the TR7. Later in the day I did, however, accompany fellow wedge car owners Jack McGahey and Steve Sanders on a 60-mile road tour we're calling the "Bill Wood Memorial Cruise" to honor a fallen friend. Bill Wood was a big guy in wedge car circles, full of enthusiasm and always giving of his time and effort. He could often be seen traveling to major shows with a concours-quality TR8 convertible on a trailer being towed by, of all things, a TR8 coupe. Bill was President of the Triumph Club of the Carolinas (TCOC) in 1999 when he tragically died as a result of injuries sustained in a fall while volunteering at his church. We hope to make this little cruise an annual event to keep Bill in our memories.

Attending the Show

The focus of The Gathering is, of course, the show itself, held on Saturday at Shelton Vineyards, a short distance from the hotel. The grounds are lushly landscaped, and the cars park on the green spaces around ponds, amid flowering trees and on the slopes around the bandstand among the vines. You could hardly ask for a more idyllic setting. This year the show set a new attendance record with 303 cars registered of all marques. My favorite was probably a Morris Traveler decked out as a surf van. The one that had me shaking my head in wonder was an otherwise beautiful E-Type with a rat rod paint job.

Following the awards I went over to the autocross venue to help the organizers set up the course.

This wasn't wholly altruistic as it gave me the chance to walk the course a couple of times to familiarize myself with it before the venue officially opened at 8:00 AM the following morning.

I know why people are hesitant to run their precious classics in these events. I was the same way for many years, but let me allay your fears. First, you won't wreck your car (unless you do something really stupid) and you don't have to go hell-for-leather on every run. The courses are set tight enough that they have to be taken at a fairly slow speed. Second, you won't make a fool of yourself. These are not hyper-competitive SCCA-type events for people who compete every weekend, but casual and pressure-free events for those who compete once, twice, or a few times per year. Third, you don't need to bring a helmet; typically a selection of loaners is available from which to choose. So give it a try; it's fun! The day I stopped sitting on the sidelines and started participating was the day my enjoyment of these events increased many times over.

Making the Grade

So how did I do? Well, on the weekend as a whole, I did fine. I got down there and back with no trouble from the car. I was second in class in participant's choice behind a beautiful Bordeaux red TR8. I was second in the 4cylinder class in autocross behind a Spitfire with a much more experienced driver. Finally, I was first in a special award for longest distance traveled (at 540 miles), and this might be the most meaningful trophy of all for those who still feel these cars were meant to be driven.@
