## New Business

<u>Paypal Account:</u> The Club is looking into and will establish a Paypal account to allow remittance of dues and other payments by the Paypal online payment service. This is in response to a number of requests by people registering for the Ocean Grove Show. Paypal charges transaction fees, and the club will levy an extra "convenience fee" when accepting Paypal payments, in keeping with what other clubs do. Payment by cash or check will still be available, and there will be no fees associated with payments made by cash or check.

<u>License Plate Frames:</u> Mike Browne has been looking into custom PEDC license plate frames. A number of samples were passed around for review. The issue with many of these frames is that most states, NJ included, have laws requiring that **all** printing on a license plate be visible, and nearly all of these frames obscure some printed features to one degree or another. This has been in the news recently as a Bernardsville man was given a \$75 ticket for a frame which partially obscured his plate. A motion was made and carried to look further, and if compliant frames could be sourced, to take preorders and proceed.

**2011 Events Calendar:** The floor was then opened for discussion on upcoming events. A great many ideas were floated, and a few volunteers stepped forward. To summarize: Ice Cream Runs will be held the 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday of the month (unless otherwise posted) from May to September. It is a well know fact that British automobiles have a tendency leak fluids. The British motor industry is not alone in this; other British industries have taken up this fine tradition. Last year, Kathy and I decided replace fixtures in our downstairs bath. A new vanity was ordered. Next, we went looking for a lavatory set (faucets) with a period appearance. After much searching, we located a set that met our expectations. It was made by *Hollys of Bath*, a division of Hornbeam Ivy, Braeside Works, Wesley Close, Frome, Bath, England. Now

that is an address! It is wideset, meaning that the handles or taps are not attached to the main body or spout. The set consisted of two taps, the main body, a manifold, a waste assembly (pop up) and fiddly

bits. The instructions were quite interesting and required reading several times to understand the meanings. First the main body was installed in the vanity from the top, then from underneath, a fiber washer, the manifold and then an O ring and brass retaining nut. The taps or side valves were installed next from underneath and the handles from the top. Two supply lines included with the set connected the taps to the manifold. Two purchased supply lines connected the taps to the shut offs. Finally, the waste assembly with pop up, which consisted of multiple pieces, was fitted to the basin. The water was turned on and I could not count the number of leaks. Everything was taken apart and re-assembled numerous times, I even replaced all the supply lines. At last there was but one stubborn drip from the hot water tap. And it was persistent. After much cursing and rolls of Teflon tape, the source of the drip was discovered. It was not in a treaded joint, it was a faulty assembly of the tap itself.

Since we were trying to complete the bathroom in time for Christmas visitors, the entire set was removed and an inexpensive set was purchased and installed in less than ½ hour with nary a single drip. All in all, we are quite pleased with the results even though we only have a temporary faucet set in place. As I write this, we are waiting for a replacement part to arrive from England. It is just like working on a Little British Car.





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
