Zinc, Engine Oil, and My Jaguar E-Type

ike so many PEDC members, I really enjoy driving my classic cars. When I had my 1971 Series II Jaguar E-Type roadster restored, quite a bit of attention was paid to the engine. It was professionally rebuilt by M2 Racing in Wall, NJ. Fuel injection, a .030-inch overbore, high compression pistons with thermal and low friction coatings, and mild head porting were some of the things we did to improve both power and durability. On the engine dyno it made 340 lb/ft of torque and 305 HP, not bad for a street XK engine running on pump gas! I have always followed the advice given to me by the legendary NASCAR engine builder Randy Dorton, (Hendrick Motorsports head engine builder until he was killed in an airplane accident a number of years ago): I break my engines in on the dyno on Rotella (a heavy-duty diesel truck engine oil made by Shell), then once off the dyno I switch to Valvoline 10W40 petroleum-based motor oil to seat the

rings and cams, followed by a switch to Mobil 1 5W30 fully synthetic after 3,000 to 5,000 miles. This procedure has been very successful with my Ford V-8 engines over the years, and it was used on the Jag motor as well.

To improve the handling of the Jag, I recently purchased a Fast Road Car suspension upgrade kit from Rob Beere Racing in England and took the car to Don's Jaguar Service in Flemington, NJ to have the kit installed. I have used Don's for specialty work on the Jag in the past and have been very happy with their work. While the car was there I asked George. the owner, to please adjust the valves since they seemed a bit noisy to me. Upon inspection of the exhaust side cam and valve clearances, it was discovered that the lash was excessive. .024 inch instead of .012 inch; the high points of the cam were worn down; and the valve tappets

were worn far beyond what they should have been in an engine with only 3,000 to 4,000 miles on it. It turned out that both cams, reground units from Terry's Jaguar, were severely worn to the point where they were no longer serviceable. This explained why, during a tuning session with Ray Maher of Specialty Performance in Pottstown, PA last fall, we noticed a drop in horsepower with no real loss in torque. In addition, while driving the car I had noticed a "dead spot" developing around 3,000 RPM, another likely result of this valve train wear.

The Cause

So what was the cause of this premature wear? Although it's possible that the reground cams might not have been properly hardened after the regrinding process, this hardly seems likely from a reputable supplier like Terry's. George at Don's Jaquar checked the oil feeds and returns for the cams and found no problems. However, the tappets were the original ones from the 31,000-mile engine, and the wear patterns established on them by the original cams could have led to the problem, according to Rob Beere, a veteran of countless XK engine rebuilds. Other experts, including George, engine builder John Gontkof, and my tuner, Ray, all cite the use of modern motor oil as the root of the problem. I believe it was a combination of these two things.

A few words about modern motor oil:

As John pointed out, the flat-faced bucket tappets in the XK engine are akin to the flat tappets used in racing engines. Such tappets generate very high contact forces between the tappet face and the cam lobe, resulting in excessive wear unless a sufficient amount of the anti-wear additive zinc dialkyldithiophosphate (ZDDP) is present in the engine's oil. Unfortunately, this additive degrades catalytic converter performance, so its use in street motor oils has been greatly reduced and modern engines have been redesigned to cope with these new oil formulations. Sadly, most of the British cars that we PEDCers own can hardly be said to have "modern" engines, so if you're not already using

high-ZDDP motor oil or a ZDDP additive in your LBC, you should consider doing so before something bad happens to your car's engine.

The Solution


Now that these problems have been identified and possible causes narrowed down, the plan is to install brand-new cams from Rob Beere Racing. These cams are very similar to the reground units from Terry's, having slightly higher lift and duration than stock but still very streetable. When the Terry's cams were first installed, the car could easily pull away from a standstill in third gear, and once moving you really didn't need to shift out of fifth until you came to a full stop.

Jaguar XK engines are very torquey and definitely not high revving, much like an American V8. The Rob Beere cams have slightly less lift but more duration than the Terry's cams, so they should flow more air and fuel. New tappets will also be installed, so there will be no concern over any previous wear patterns, and the cam bearings will be replaced as the old ones show quite a bit of wear. A valve job will also be performed to improve valve seating. The redone head will be reinstalled using a high-performance, multilayer steel head gasket from Cometic Gasket. These gaskets require no sealant, and I have used them successfully in the past.

To break in this new top end, I'll be starting with 15W40 Rotella T, changing to fresh Rotella and a new filter after about the first hour of running. This second round of Rotella will stay in for about the first 1,000 miles, and then it will be back to Mobil 1, but this time with ZDDP additive from the Eastwood Company. After this work is completed, a new tune will be in order, both to map the air/fuel mixture properly, and to compare horsepower and



From the Driver's Seat

By now, I assume everyone is tired with winter and the snow this year that never seems to leave. But the good news is spring is right around the corner. With that in mind Nadine and I have started to plan a drive that was scheduled for last year, but circumstances did not allow it to happen. Several years ago we attended a drive to the Covered Bridges of Bucks County, Pennsylvania and really enjoyed it. So we decided we would like to repeat it and recently prepared to get it organized. Even though it had snowed two days before, the weather improved and we drove to Bucks County to check out the bridges that were recommended on a website we visited. As it turned out, the roads were fairly bare, even though there were some spots that were single lane only.

The tour will begin at Washington Crossing State Park and travel through five covered bridges. Right now we intend to see the Van Sant Covered Bridge built in 1870 and the Loux Covered Bridge built in 1874. When we toured the last time it was in the fall. The leaves were turning, and it was a little cool. This time we will try the spring, before the trees are in full bloom so we

can appreciate the landscape. We will then see the Cabin Run Covered Bridge from 1871 and the Frankenfield Covered Bridge from 1872. The last bridge that we went through was Erwinna Covered Bridge from 1832. There is another bridge that is nearby, Uhlerstown, built in 1832; however, it is closed during the winter months, so we will have to wait to see if it will fit in with our driving tour.

There are other suggested bridges in Bucks County which make up the 12 remaining bridges, but we think the trip will be too long, especially for those of you who have an hour or two's drive just to get to Pennsylvania. We thought we would have lunch—since we must have a meal on a drive—around the Frenchtown area. The place we sampled on this trip didn't quite meet expectations, so we will have to do some other sampling before we finalize the trip. We thought we could then take some back roads down to Lambertville and back east through Hopewell.

LBCs in Winter

Growing up in the 60s and 70s on the Watchung Mountains of Somerset County, NJ always meant lots of cold, snowy winters. Although sledding and skiing were all plenty of fun in fresh snow, driving was a nightmare. Back then most cars were not equipped with traction control, all-wheel drive, or even posi-traction. We all had rear-wheel drive cars with what I used to call "onewheel drive" or, as Mona Lisa Vito explained in the film My Cousin Vinny, "The '64 Skylark had a regular differential, which, anyone who's been stuck in the mud in Alabama knows, you step on the gas, one tire spins, the other tire does nothing."

To help us get around we all had an extra set of wheels in the garage that had snow tires mounted to them. I worked in a gas station during high school, so I remember the mad rush of customers all coming in the day before the first snow storm to get their snow tires put on their cars. This improved the odds that you could get up and down the mountain roads, but not by

much. Sometimes you just weren't getting home until the plow/salt/sand truck came through. I think that's why most of the neighborhood taverns below the hills were packed during a snowy evening.

So, being a young, informed, well-grounded driver living in this environment, understandably I bought a Triumph Spitfire as my first car. If my Dad's Buick had one-wheel drive, then you could reason that my car had 'half-wheel drive." Frankly, if the roads were at all slippery my buddies always had odds about my getting where I was going. I tried putting weight in the trunk, but even with 100 lbs of sand as ballast I always risked bouncing off a curb on a snowy day. It was so thoughtful of the Brits to put big frame eyelets at all four corners of the frame so I could be tugged out of a ditch.

I remember one slippery ride home where I managed to make it up the steep road from Bound Brook and had only a half-mile of fairly level roadway to reach home. Once the hard part was through, I guess I relaxed . . . and slid uncontrollably on an ice patch into the curb. I should have taken my father's advice and bought spare front suspension parts in bulk!

Flash forward to today. Most cars on the road now are front-wheel drive, all-wheel drive, or maybe four-wheel drive. These drivetrains, coupled with some all-season radials, make getting around in winter weather much easier. However, one could argue that with cars so much more sure-footed today the average driver does not have to be as skilled as in years past. Maybe that's why after a good snowstorm we see so many SUVs being towed from ditches and accidents with trees and telephone poles.

I hope that by the time you are reading this we are done with winter. I can't wait to hit the nice, dry roads with my Spitfire!

Helpful Hints ~

AFTER A LAPSE OF MANY

months, I am resuming this column. Since the appearance of the last submission (with the exception of an old one that was dug up and run in the February 2014 issue of *Healey Marque*) I have survived two hurricanes and some major computer failures.

Last year Hurricane Sandy gave my area a power outage of over two weeks. In a stroke of good luck, after a week of no power, we went to the local supermarket for nonperishable groceries in time to see that they had just received a stock of generators. I was able to buy the last one. All other stores, hardware, Home Depot, etc., were sold out and severely backordered with long waiting lists.

Subsequent to that experience two external hard drives and the internal one in my computer failed—the motors burned out on all three. Although the Geek Squad was able to recover some files, it has been a painstaking experience. However, I have confidence now that I use the Cloud [the internet] to store my files, so this should not be a problem for me again. We shall see. That being said, here we go with a new installment.

The column *Hints from Heloise* has been a staple in our household for years.

Started over 50 years ago, it appears in over 500 newspapers daily. Many of the hints in this column have a caption of "Why didn't I think of that." The following items can be entitled *Hints from John*.

Over the past couple of years, there have been many time-saving suggestions on the Healey Mail List (and some that I dreamed up) that bear repeating here. The best part of these hints is that none will "break" the bank.

Tightening Shocks

To keep shocks from loosening up, and they will over time, use Nord Lok washers or Belleville washers. These are available from McMaster-Carr or other similar companies.

Replacing Heater Ducts

To reattach the heater cold air duct to the heater fan assembly while the fenders are on, remove the right front wheel and replace the four heater fan attachment bolts at the fender one at a time. Use 6" lag screws, screwing them in approximately one half of an inch. This will allow movement of the heater fan assembly, making it easier to attach the duct, and enable you to easily refasten the fan unit.

When finished attaching the duct, pull the fan assembly taut to the fender well by pulling on the lag screws.

Replace the lag screws one at a time with the proper bolts, snugging the heater fan assembly to the fender wall. I used this method several years ago to replace the duct that the previous owner had installed. Rather than using the correct ones, he had used a clothes dryer duct.

Testing Electrical Parts

A model train transformer that outputs 12 volts DC can be used to bench test many electric parts such as fuel pumps.

Organizing Small Parts

A fishing tackle box will hold most of the small tools, sockets, and parts that you keep in your boot to use in emergencies while traveling. The best-size box is 8" high by 8" deep by 16" wide with a removable tray.

Using Springs

Springs from ball point pens can be used in various parts of the carburetors, such as the springs to hold the jet screws' adjustment tight.

Cleaning Chrome

A quick method of cleaning chrome is to rub it gently with aluminum foil. This will easily get road grime off of the chrome so that you can then use a gentle polish on it.

Keeping Clean

When working on the car with the wheels off, placing foam beverage cups on the axle stubs can prevent getting grease all over your clothes and at the same time keep peace in your household. Small plastic bags, such as Baggies, held on with rubber bands will also do the trick.

Using Jacks or Stands

This next one is, to me, common sense. Last year I shopped for a new low-profile floor jack. After finding one and reading the reviews, one person had given it only one star. His reasoning for such a poor rating was that when he lifted his car, the jack came down over a period of a few days. To my mind, jacks are meant to raise the car temporarily and be replaced by jack stands. More than a few minutes on a jack is pure folly.

Again, common sense and a little bit of thinking out of the box will enable one to make some of the Healey tasks a little easier to perform.

Historic Vehicle Plates and NJ Law \sim

John Sims shares the information below from fellow Austin-Healey owners regarding pending NJ legislation that affects drivers of all historic cars, including British margues other than the Austin-Healey:

Below are two links to SEMA notices about pending NJ legislation that may be of interest to club members. [Note: The Specialty Equipment and Market Association (SEMA), http://www.semasan.com/page.asp?content=state_leg&g=semaga, is a trade association consisting of "a diverse group of manufacturers, distributors, retailers, publishing companies, auto restorers, street rod builders, restylers, car clubs, race teams, and more." ~Ed.]

Windshield Stickers

The first bill, see link below, would require the NJ Motor Vehicle Comission (MVC) to issue windshield stickers for vehicles exempt from inspection requirements, such as historic vehicles. The rationale is to alert some not-so-bright law enforcement personnel that certain vehicles are exempt and therefore should not be stopped or ticketed because they do not have a current inspection sticker. A fellow Healey owner writes, "This bill is overkill as far as I am concerned, because I have never heard of a Healey owner with historic plates being stopped for lack of sticker."

Pleasure Driving

The second link, *below*, is to a bill that would explicitly allow owners of historic vehicles to drive their cars one day a week for mere pleasure. This would expand the current historic restriction which states that historic vehicles may be driven only for exhibition and education purposes by the owner. This bill would in effect codify my existing practice of driving for fun one or two days a week in the non-winter season. I like this bill because it would allow more legal driving of our cars, even though I am not aware of any problems club members have had with pleasure driving under existing law. torque values between the old and new cams. I expect to pick up horsepower and lose the valve clatter.

My next engine project will be the fitment of a new Mangoletsi intake manifold with 42 mm runners versus the current 45 mm and provisions for an idle air control motor to control idle RPM at start up and when warm. The new manifold will also allow for placement of the fuel injectors at the head ports, which will supposedly produce more power along with better emissions. When the new manifold is installed, I'll be able to run the injectors in the throttle bodies as I do now or at the head ports, so we will tune both possibilities and collect data on them.

I have had the pleasure of working with John Mangoletsi as a beta tester for his older manifold design and cable-operated throttle systems, so he is sending me the new manifold to test it against the older design, and I'll be supplying him with customer feedback as well as dyno data. To the best of my knowledge, mine is the first left hand drive cable-operated throttle system in a Jaguar E-Type, at least in the US. I can hardly wait to see how the new manifold works out!




