## Brake Systems 101

**ABOUT 50 PEOPLE** turned out March 1<sup>st</sup> for Motorcar Garage's annual Open House and Tech Session, filling PEDCer Pete Cosmides's shop in Maple Shade, NJ to the rafters. PEDC members accounted for roughly a dozen of the spectators, with the British Motor Club of Southern New Jersey making up most of the rest along with representatives from a host of other area clubs, including Delaware Valley Triumphs and the Philadelphia MG Club. After enjoying coffee and donuts, generously provided by our host, and milling around the shop for awhile, swapping LBC stories and ogling ongoing projects such as a rare (and especially fine) MGC-GT,

the standing-room-only crowd settled down to listen to the master discourse on the topic of the day, brake systems.

Pete started out by using a hand-drawn but completely understandable diagram of a basic brake system to give us an overview of how everything in the system works together, a sort of Brake Systems 101. Even if you're familiar with this stuff, as most of us are, it's nice to have it explained once again by an expert. Pete used plenty of actual parts to illustrate what he was talking about as he went over individual components of the brake system, telling us what sort of problems can occur with

each one and what to look for when inspecting the brake system. He explained which components could be rebuilt and which ones were more cost-effective to replace with new ones, such as wheel cylinders.

He also cautioned against simple rebuilds of master cylinders, as they are likely to turn out badly. Instead he recommended they be

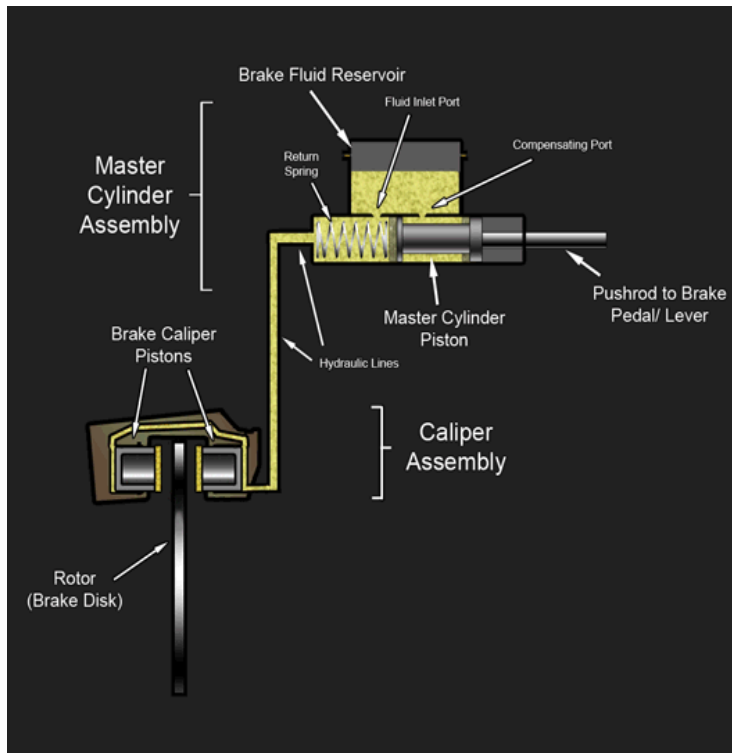
re-manufactured by a professional outfit such as White Post Restorations or Apple Hydraulics, who have the means to re-sleeve the bore, or replaced with new units, preferably from the original equipment manufacturer if available. Pete also offered tips on brake system bleeding. He also mentioned the importance of using the correct brake fluid for your system to prevent seal damage as well as ensuring that brake fluid can be kept tightly sealed to prevent absorption of moisture.

After a brief Q&A session Pete turned everyone loose

to roam the back lot, examining and debating still more projects. By now it was time for lunch, without which no PEDC outing is complete. So the remaining PEDCers adjourned to a luncheonette just up the street, whose simple fare and friendly waitresses reminded us of a bygone era when really cool guys drove shiny MGs and Triumphs as their daily rides, making sure to park them out front where everyone would see them.

If you've never been to a Motorcar Garage tech session, you're missing a great time. But there's always next year! ■

## Off He Goes into the Wild Blue Yonder

**ON SATURDAY MARCH 8<sup>th</sup>, MAJOR General Charles E. Reed, Jr., United States Air Force Reserve, Retired,** presided over a retirement ceremony honoring Colonel Jonathan W. Spare, Vice Commander of the 514<sup>th</sup> Air Mobility Wing, Air Force Reserve Command, Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst, NJ for his 30+ years of service. The 514<sup>th</sup> has 24 subordinate units that support airlift, air refueling, and aeromedical evacuation. Jon was responsible for training and equipping 2,800 military personnel. Maj Gen Reed presented Jon with the Legion of Merit award to add his other distinguished military decorations. In attendance at Jon's ceremony were various military and civilian dignitaries, numerous 514<sup>th</sup> Air Mobility Wing personnel, Jon's family, and many friends, including 13 PEDC loyal fans.

Wayne Simpson organized our first drive of the season, which began at Woody's for lunch and ended at Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst by way

of an exhilarating drive along some really great roads with lots of twists and turns—perfect for our little British cars. When we arrived at the base, Jon had arranged for us to park right outside Hangar 2201 where the ceremony took place. We parked alongside Jon's black 1980 TR7-V8 DHC. He presented each of us with special coins he had made to commemorate the occasion.

The retirement ceremony included some traditional military customs, such as the flag folding ceremony; reciting of the Airman's Creed; and playing of our national anthem, which in this case was performed by Jon's son Nathan on drum and daughter Victoria on saxophone. Later in the ceremony a quartet wearing Philadelphia Eagles shirts—as a tribute to Jon, who is an avid Eagles fan—surprised us all with a great rendition of "The U.S. Air Force Song," encouraging the audience to sing along:

*Off we go into the wild blue yonder,  
Climbing high into the sun  
Here they come zooming to meet our thunder  
At 'em boys, Give 'er the gun!  
Down we dive, spouting our flame from under  
Off with one helluva roar!  
We live in fame or go down in flames.  
Hey! Nothing can stop the U.S. Air Force!*

In a touching tribute to Jon's wife, Cheryl, and children, Nathan, Samuel, Victoria, and Candace, Maj Gen Reed presented them with special awards for their sacrifices as a military family during Jon's long career.

After the ceremony we were invited to climb aboard the KC-10 Extender, similar to the one Jon flew. It is used for refueling aircraft aloft—basically a gas station in the sky to us laymen. We also climbed into a C-17 Globemaster III, used for military airlift. These cargo aircraft are large enough to transport helicopters, tanks, and other vehicles and large equipment. What an amazing day. We PEDCers were glad to be there. ■

to see him and Cheryl on more drives. Thank you again to Jon for allowing us to share that special day with him and his family and friends.

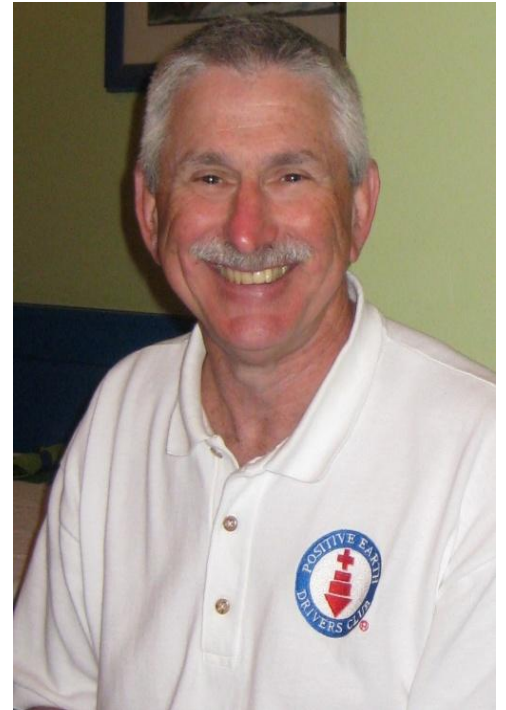
### Bumper Re-chrome Woes

Since today, as I write this column, was beyond the promised due date, I called early to find out if the bumpers were ready for pickup. No answer. I called twice more and still no answer. So I have no idea if the bumpers are re-chromed and are ready to be reinstalled or if I will never see those original bumpers again.

## From the Navigator's Seat

### Winter LBC Therapy

Little British Car (LBC) folks are drawn to the dark side by different lures. Mine was always the mechanical challenges of maintaining and improving my Spitfire. I always liked playing in my garage with new tools, performance enhancements, and testing my own Rube Goldberg gadgets. As 2013 was an agonizingly long winter, I was able to tackle a lot of LBC projects, and during these I made some random notes, as shown below:

- I was very glad I spent a few extra dollars for insulated garage doors when I replaced them last summer.
- Nothing is more secure to hold your car off the floor than some solid wood blocks.
- A good angle grinder can save you hours of time when removing frozen suspension bushing bolts.
- You can never have enough magnetic trays to hold parts.
- The previous owner is always a jerk (even if it is you).

- Hoarding does not count when collecting extra hose pieces, nuts & bolts, rubber caps & plugs, metal plates and shapes, wire connectors, or hand tools.
- After the third time assembling a Spitfire front suspension I am an expert.
- With a 6" bench grinder, some buffing wheels and rouge, and a little patience you can turn any metal parts into jewelry.
- K&N cleaner and oil are worth it (red air filters look cool).
- To work a full Saturday on an LBC it helps to have a garage with a refrigerator and a good stereo.
- The MG Experience, <http://www.mgexp.com>, and the Triumph Experience, <http://www.triumphexp.com>, deserve some credit for helping me complete projects and keeping my sanity.
- You can never have too much dielectric grease for electrical connections and rubber bushing installations.
- Working for CRC has provided me with an endless supply of products for cleaning, lubricating, and sealing things on my LBCs.
- Nitrile gloves, safety glasses, and bandages are essential for winter LBC work.

This year we were a little late in sending out last-minute reminders to renew PEDC memberships, but I think the miserable winter also kept the PEDC out-of-mind for many members. ## Important Clarification ~

With reference to the article "Helpful Hints," in the March 2014 issue of *The Terminal Post*, page 8, we'd like to clarify the information in **Testing Electrical Parts**. If you plan to use a model train transformer to test electrical parts, we recommend that you (1) use a DC voltmeter to verify that the output of the transformer does not exceed 12 volts before using it, and (2) refrain from using a train transformer to test any electronic components such as radios and solid-state fuel pumps unless you are certain the transformer has a filtered output.





## A Beatles Tribute

**WHO ELSE BUT BEATLE JOHN LENNON** could get away with having this custom paint job done on a 1965 Phantom V Rolls Royce? Although the Rolls was delivered to Lennon in factory white, he had it painted a matt black. In 1967 he decided to have it painted like the Romani gypsy wagon residing in his backyard, or *garden* as the Brits would say. It is not a psychedelic design as many observers once believed. The exterior ornamentation consists of scrollwork, flowers, and zodiac signs on a bright yellow background. The interior was outfitted with a telephone, portable refrigerator, and Sony TV with custom sound system. Not surprisingly the rear seat could be converted to a double bed. Evidently the Beatles used Lennon's Rolls from 1966 to 1969, and at some point it was lent to other rock stars for various occasions. To Beatles fans, the Lennon Rolls Royce, which would become known as The Yellow Submarine, was indeed the ultimate pop culture icon.

Not everyone was enamoured with this unique Rolls Royce, however, as evidenced by this quote: "John's newly painted . . . car drew some public outrage when an old woman, in London's downtown, attacked the car using her umbrella and yelling, 'You swine, you swine! How dare you do this to a Rolls Royce.' Obviously, the Rolls Royce is passionately regarded in England as one of the many symbols of British dignity!"

Ordinarily I would be loathe to feature such a garish British car in *The Terminal Post*, but I could not resist paying homage to John Lennon, especially in this 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary year since the Beatles came to America and helped launch the British Invasion. By the way, this famous Rolls Royce now resides in the Royal British Columbia Museum, Victoria, British Columbia, Canada. ■

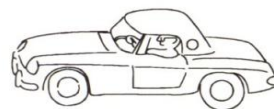
