
ABOUT THE EVENT





Minutes of the October 5, 2022 General Meeting

Newsletter Editor Carol Kyle mentioned that the October issue of *The Terminal Post* is our big Brits on the Beach issue, this one with 10 pages devoted to the show. President Ken noted that a few members have had trouble getting club emails, including the newsletter, due to a possible problem with Mailchimp, the platform used to send the monthly newsletter and club email blasts. President Ken updated members on club events since the last meeting:

Miscellaneous



Is There an MGB Doctor in the House?

As a club member, I was aware of the exploits of the PEDC Garage Squad, but, being a relatively hands-on British car

owner – having fully restored a '53 MGTD that I lost in Hurricane Sandy – I never thought I'd need their help. However, last spring I found myself in a situation whereby my '66 MGB would start, run for a while, then quit. I tried everything I knew to resolve the problem but just couldn't get it to keep running. Then, to make matters worse, I faced a couple of health challenges, which made it much more difficult for me to work on

the car. I talked to Ken Kyle and Bob Canfield at our Father's Day show, and Bob said the Garage Squad would be glad to help. Bob called me shortly thereafter and scheduled a visit. I didn't quite know what to expect, but on the appointed day Bob and John Quelch showed up, as well as Scott Freund, Lenny Giles, and Jim Lamb. I explained my problem, and all of a sudden there were 10 hands working on the MG! Not only were they working under the hood, but they also jacked up the car, pulled the wheels, checked the gas supply, and evaluated the brakes, steering, suspension, etc., etc., etc. It certainly was "all hands on deck."

Well, after a couple of hours of diligent investigation they found the culprit. It turns out that the condenser in the distributor worked fine until it heated up. Then it failed. After a quick replacement and some other adjustments, the MG was running better than it ever had! In the process of checking out the car, the guys found a few other things that they recommended I address, including rear brake cylinders, axle bearings, and a lot of front-end work. And they said they would be glad to help with all of that. These guys are an incredible group! So, I ordered the parts that they recommended and, after a few more visits (including another Garage Squad member, Paul Johnson), my "B" is pretty much running like new.

I am in awe of their knowledge, capabilities, and how much time they spend helping club members. Thank you. Thank you. Thank you. All of us PEDCers are very lucky to have them! ■




