Saturday, September 17th, saw the 25th consecutive staging of the PEDC premier car show known since 2009 as Brits on the Beach. For the last 14 years, with the exception of 2020 when the pandemic forced us to move the show to Woodv's, it's been held in the charming seaside hamlet of Ocean Grove, which becomes the PEDC's second home on show day every year.

Traditions Old and New

Many of our show traditions returned this year, including the presentation of the colors by Jon Spare's Air Force Junior

ROTC (AFJROTC) cadets from the Jackson school system, music by DJ Rich, and, of course, the sale of commemorative T-shirts. This year a new tradition was established with the addition of a Best Presentation trophy for the car accompanied by the best display, which was awarded

to Dave and Nancy Pittman for their 1974 MGB GT.

The Showstoppers

There seemed to be a special vibe surrounding this year's show field, possibly because it held the most cars in years, but also because

there were so many exceptional cars in it this time and the energy around them was so high. A realignment of the Jaguar sports car classes into pre-1997 cars and post-1996 cars saw an unprecedented number of cars entered in both classes, including not one, but two magnificent XK140 MC open two-seaters. One of them, John Burke's green 1957, won a well-deserved best in class.

Steve Mirante's 1994 MG RV8, a V8-powered evolution of the MGB that never made it stateside when new, got plenty of attention, as did our three trophy winners in the Other Saloons class: Peter Zoll's majestic 1947 Bentley Mark VI, Christopher Law's diminutive 1937 Austin Seven (the car that put Britain on wheels), and Gary Watson's handsome Riley RMD.

Another crowd pleaser was the 1952 Arnolt-MG exhibited by Zig Panek (see previous page). This very rare car, one of only 103 ever made, features a body by Italian coachbuilder Bertone on an MG TD chassis and running gear. I hope you examined it closely if you were there, because you'll probably never see another one.

A Visit from Gloria

And then there was our Best in Show winner. British car fanatic Dennis Mamchur (*shown here*) originally intended to bring us his TR3, but Show Chairman Bob somehow managed to

Besides its striking good looks and the fact that it's one of only three in this country, what makes this car so special is that it was engineered by British sports car legend Donald Healey. Only 15 of these beautiful machines are known to survive.

The Sports Car with Elan

Sixty years ago this month the greatest LBC of all time, in terms of performance and pure driving pleasure, made its debut at the legendary Earls Court Motor Show. It became the first true commercial success for Lotus and helped the company recover after losing money on the handsome but expensive to manufacture and notoriously unreliable Lotus Elite.

What Made the Elan Great The Elan broke new ground for Lotus with its steel backbone chassis and double overhead cam engine based on the Ford Kent engine's iron block and topped with a cylinder head designed by Harry Mundy and refined by Keith Duckworth of Cosworth Engineering fame. Power output ranged from 105 bhp for the earliest 1.5 liter engines to 126 bhp for the last 1.6 liter "big valve" version. That may not sound like much but, thanks to Lotus's obsession with weight reduction, the cars tipped the scales at a featherweight 1500 pounds and were much quicker than anything else in their size class. Zero to sixty times as low as 7.5 seconds were reported in contemporary road tests. The Elan was also equipped with four-wheel disk brakes and a fully independent suspension at a time when most of its contemporaries were still making do with rear drums and solid rear axles.

About 12,000 Elans of all variants were sold between 1962 and the the end of production in 1974. That's a drop in the bucket compared to MGB and Triumph TR production, but it was a big

success for Lotus. No doubt its price ensured the Elan's exclusivity. In 1967 prices for an Elan S2 drophead started at \$4550, while a TR4 could be had for \$2899 and an MGB roadster went for a mere \$2600. Even a big Healey was only \$3565. The Elan was a very exotic little car for its time, largely handmade, and that was reflected in its price. Today the best examples can easily top \$70K.

A Lasting Legacy

The Elan took the LBC to a new level of sophistication and served as a template for the modern, small-displacement sports car. The 1990 Mazda Miata, which single-handedly resuscitated the small-sports-car market, was essentially a steel-bodied Elan with its pop-up headlights and longitudinal truss connecting the engine and differential to improve the car's rigidity, along with all the other requisite bits like a fourcylinder DOHC engine, fourwheel disks, and fully independent suspension.

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Certainly the Elan was not without its faults. It had the typical British electrical issues, water pumps were said to be a weak point, its lightweight construction can charitably be described as delicate, and the Rotoflex couplings (aka rubber "donuts") taking the place of CV or U joints in the rearaxle half shafts were short-lived. Nonetheless, the word *elan*, meaning style and energetic spirit, is definitely an appropriate name for this little car that continues to impress and inspire us to this day.



August 18th – Ice cream run to Nicholas Creamery in Fair Haven, NJ. Dean & Arlene LaVergne were hosts, and Dean noted that dinner was good at Surf in Rumson, NJ. Ten members in six British cars participated.

August 25th – Ice cream run to Gil & Bert's Ice Cream in Cranbury, NJ. Mark & Nadine Berkowsky hosted this one with a great turnout of 24 members in 9 British cars.

September 1st – Drive to Sweetwater Marina and Riverdeck in Sweetwater, NJ, on the Mullica River. Mike & Linda Browne led this drive with 22 members, and 1 prospective member, participating in 12 British cars.






PEDC Board Meeting Minutes – August 2022

Board members present: Ken Kyle, Woody Smith, Dean LaVergne, Allan Wysmuller, Mike Browne, Bob Canfield, Steve Mundt, John Quelch, and Mark Wintjen

President Ken Kyle called the Zoom meeting to order at 6:04 PM.

Agenda Items Covered

Cash-Flow Report - Treasurer Dean LaVergne presented a cashflow report for the period May through July of 2022. Dues income continues to come in with 25 new members joining during the quarter, bringing in a total of \$375.00. President Ken noted that, with anticipated revenue from Brits on the Beach and the Summer Show at Woody's factored in, the club is in its strongest financial position ever. A motion to approve the cash-flow report was made, seconded, and carried unanimously.

Summer Show at Woody's -

President Ken reported that only 60 of 90 tickets to the show had been sold prior to the date change dictated by the management of Woody's. On show day, only 37 of 54 cars still expected to participate actually turned out, even though the weather was pleasant. As a result of the shortfall in ticket sales, show expenses exceeded revenue by \$260. President Ken attributed the weak ticket sales and low actual turnout to the summer heat and the date change, respectively. Unfortunately, because the Summer Show is purposely scheduled to take place midway between the Father's Day Show and Brits on the Beach, it falls during the hottest and most unpredictable weather of the year.

President Ken also briefed the Board on a confrontation that took place during the show between one of the owners of Woody's and one of our members, in which the member was

accused of being rude to one of the wait staff. President Ken investigated the incident in question by speaking to all members who witnessed the interaction between our member and the wait staff. All agreed that the member had not behaved rudely and that the wait staff member had been sullen and unfriendly throughout the meal. The Board expressed concern over the incident but reached a consensus that a change in meeting venue is not warranted at this time. Should there be any further incidents of this kind, the Board will reconsider the possibility of a move to a new venue.

Because of the low turnout and the aforementioned incident. President Ken stated that he does not plan to organize another show at Woody's. Sunshine Spending – President Ken asked the Board to raise the spending limit on flowers for deceased club members and immediate family members to \$140 per occurrence to cope with rising prices. The Board agreed to this request without objection.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:47 PM. ■
