












It's PEDC Election Time!

Every two years the PEDC must hold elections for our four officer positions: president, vice president, treasurer. and secretary. Per the club bylaws, members are limited to two consecutive terms in any one office. VP Woody Smith, Treasurer Dean LaVergne, and I have each served two consecutive terms in our current positions and are not permitted to run for reelection. Secretary Allan Wysmuller has served only one term in office but has decided not to run for reelection as well. And although eligible to do so, none of us wishes to run for an office other than our current one. Therefore, all four positions are up for grabs this year.

Who's Eligible to Run?

The bylaws state that all members in good standing (meaning that their dues are paid up) are eligible to run for office provided that they have been members for at least one year on election day. For this election, that means anyone who joined the club on or before November 1, 2022 is eligible to run. Note that this includes spouses and partners. Former officers are

allowed to run, as well, for any office including ones they held previously.

The Election Process

Members who wish to run for office must self-nominate by notifying Secretary Allan of their candidacy by September 18, 2023. Third-party nominations will not be accepted, because we don't want anyone to feel that they're being forced into running by another member. Candidates for office will then be announced in the October newsletter and at the October general meeting. The October newsletter will also include a ballot that can be mailed in or scanned and emailed to the club secretary.

Primary members and spouses/ partners must submit separate ballots if both wish to vote. Members may also vote in person at the November general meeting, where all votes will be counted and the winners will be announced. The election results will also be announced in an email blast. Voting is not anonymous, as the bylaws require us to verify the eligibility of each voter.

Some Important Considerations

The club cannot function without all of its officer positions filled. It is essential that members step up to fill these leadership roles. I have heard members say that being an officer looks like too much work or that they're too busy to take it on, but here are some facts to consider. My three immediate predecessors as club president - Russ Sharples, Mark Berkowsky, and Rodney Ford – all had full-time jobs when they were in office, yet each managed to do an outstanding job leading the club. Furthermore, the basic officer duties defined in the bylaws are not particularly burdensome. The president is the chief executive of the club and presides at general meetings and board of trustee meetings. The vice president fills in for the president when he or she is unavailable. The treasurer keeps track of the club's finances, and the secretary takes meeting minutes and keeps track of the club's records. Nowhere in the bylaws does it say that the president or any other officer has to write a newsletter column; in fact, you don't even have to have a newsletter. All that's required is that there be 11 monthly meetings and 4 board meetings each year.

I urge each of you to read the bylaws and see this for yourself. They're in every issue of the club member directory. If you don't have the directory handy, I would be happy to email it to you.

Naturally there's more to these positions in practice, but they will be what you make them, not what your predecessors

made them. I can promise you two things if you take the helm of this club: one, my fellow officers and I, along with club IT Manager Russ Sharples, will work with you to ensure a smooth transition and will be available for advice afterward, if asked; and, two, none of us will ever criticize anything you do after you assume office as long as you follow the bylaws and obey all state and federal laws.

Each group of officers puts its own stamp on the club, which is as it should be. If you're interested in running for office, I strongly suggest you get three of your friends in the club to run with you as a team so you're all on the same page once you take over.

A Final Word

Of the 85 PEDC newsletter columns I've written since 2016,



This is our 14th year (since 2009) in Ocean Grove, NJ, a lovely seaside resort at the Jersey Shore, listed in the National Register of Historic Places. It's proved to be a great venue for us, with its quaint shops and eateries. The beach & boardwalk are just two blocks from the show field. Stroll the town and view their beautiful Victorian architecture, including the Great Auditorium built in the 1890s. Admission to Brits on the Beach is free for visitors and spectators. DJ extraordinaire Rich Canfield will provide live music from all eras for all ages - with plenty of British Invasion music - so bring the family for a day of fun. It's a great way to spend the day. IN THE SUMMER OF 2022 I was at a family get together chatting about cars with my nephew Todd Cooke. He was interested in

buying one but

wanted something different. We talked about car design and reliability, cost of maintenance, gas engine efficiency, electric drivetrains, comfort, and style. He didn't want to buy a new car due to the heavy depreciation a new car experiences; he wanted something that would hold its value and be repairable, and most of all represent a classic design. The range of cars he was interested in ran from vintage Porsche 911s and BMW 3.0 CSs at the high end, through 70s and 80s Saabs

and VWs, to the MGB GT. A quick search demonstrated that Porsches and BMWs were out of his \$10K price range as were decent examples of the 70s and 80s cars, but an MGB GT was feasible. The conversation up to this point had felt theoretical, but pretty quickly I was getting from Todd "how about this one" emails every couple of days.

Being in the car hobby we PEDCers know the best hunting grounds for good-value cars. Todd started with Google searches, and I was surprised at all the really poor-quality cars he turned up at high prices on sketchy sites. VIN searches confirmed some of these ads to be outright scams, where the car description and photos are lifted from a years-old classified ad and posted as a new offer. Pretty quickly we settled on running our searches on Bring a Trailer (BaT) and Hemmings, where there's a regular crop of MG options showing up every month.

Behind the Wheel Seals the Deal

While we were waiting for the right car to appear (not too rough, not too expensive, not too far away, well-documented) I invited Todd up to a Sunday tech day at Tom Vash's shop. There were several MGB GTs there along with a smattering of other classic British cars, so he had the opportunity to ride in one and really feel what it was like. John Sprake had come with his 1974 MGB GT and generously let me take Todd out for a drive. Todd loved it and wasn't the least concerned about a lack of air conditioning, air bags, or feeling like a tiny bug surround by SUVs. Todd was roughly familiar with how to drive a manual transmission, but we spent some time in the afternoon in my MGA letting him drive around the neighborhood so he could confirm he was comfortable with a clutch, manual steering, and manual brakes. With that test passed, the search started in earnest.



Passing Along the Love of Classic British Cars to a New Generation

Enter Bring a Trailer (BaT)

We screened a bunch of possibilities found in various parts of the country and spent some time vetting a white 1974 MGB GT in Michigan that a friend of his happened to see on the street with a For Sale sign. It appeared to be a solid car, an authentic survivor that had been well maintained. but it was too far away to assess. While we considered how to get it checked out, the car sold locally. Just a week later though, a nearly identical white 1974 MGB GT popped up in a No Reserve auction on BaT. There were relatively few people watching and commenting on the car, and it looked pretty nice. Unfortunately it was in Kentucky so checking it out in person was impractical. It appeared to be a genuine 26K mile car that had maintenance records showing yearly maintenance up until the cylinder head was removed around 2006 for a valve job. Then the car was left in this state for 14 years until it was sold on BaT as a non-running project for \$7050 in 2020. The BaT buyer put a different cylinder head on it, got it running, and posted it in this No Reserve auction in 2022. The lack of auction watchers

and interest in the comments meant this could be a real opportunity for a bargain. Just 15 minutes before the 7-day auction's end, the car was still sitting at \$5400. But as typically happens with BaT, it was the last few minutes where all the action happened. There were six bidders at the end: Todd's first bid was \$5775, and pretty quickly it was down to just Todd and one other bidder as they ratcheted the price up \$100 at a time every 2 minutes (BaT extends the auction for 2 minutes each time a new bid is put in to prevent "sniping"). Todd finally won the car for \$8200, which we felt was a bargain - it was running, with good oil pressure in the videos; there was just one small dent in the otherwise clean and well painted body; the interior looked clean and complete; and there was no evidence of rust perforation, just a few bits of surface rust.

Success! Now to Get 'er Home

At first Todd thought he might fly to Kentucky and drive it back to Pennsylvania, but the condition of the tires meant that that was a very sketchy proposition. Getting new tires installed on location was complicated. It turned out that the seller knew of an enclosed transporter that was headed east in a week and would haul the car for just \$800. We took that offer, and since Todd happened to be on a business trip when the car arrived on September 13th, I agreed to meet the transporter at Todd's house.

I was nervous that the car would not be as nice in person as it had been in the BaT photos, but when

the trailer was opened, the car did not disappoint! The body was excellent and the car started right up, idled, and easily backed out of the trailer. After inspecting the car for shipping damage and signing the paperwork, I drove the car the short distance to Todd's house. Unfortunately, during that short trip (the car was probably running for a total of 10 or 15 minutes) the engine started to lose power and struggled to get up the hill of the driveway. Parking the car in the driveway in front of the garage, I found it difficult to keep the car running. It certainly needed a tune-up. We knew the interior was original with the typical signs of wear on the seats and door cards, but I also found that the seat springs were shot and the inside of the car was pretty smelly. Once I moved it into the garage, I found it had left a pretty decent puddle of oil in the driveway - a steady stream of oil was running from the tappet covers on the side of the engine.

So the car looked good, smelled bad, ran poorly, and leaked oil. Hey it's an old British car, so that's gotta be a win, right? Not quite! The devil is in the details . . . and the carburetors . . . and the suspension bushings . . . and the valvetrain . . . and the wheel cylinders . . . and the brake calipers

A Look Back at 2020 ~ Brits on the Beach at Woody's



The Show Went On!

An unprecedented (in our lifetime) viral pandemic changed the way many regional car clubs operated in 2020. Many were forced to cancel indoor meetings, car shows, and other club events; however, the PEDC carried on in spite of enormous challenges. Ocean Grove, NJ, which has staged our annual Brits on the Beach car shows since 2009, canceled our show just six weeks before our

scheduled date, September 26, 2020. Then the private caterer in West Long Branch, NJ, Branches, which had agreed to stage our show in its parking lot, gave us just 18 days' notice before canceling. Both Ocean Grove and Branches were concerned about crowd control and public safety in the midst of a pandemic, understandably (though Ocean Grove was able to stage a fall craft show right after what would have been our annual British car show that year).

Show Chairman Bob Canfield and President Ken Kyle rallied, with support from the executive team and the board of trustees, arranging with Woody's to stage our show October 3, 2020. All things considered, Brits on the Beach 2020 at Woody's went very well with a show field of 74 registered cars (though 94 had registered), trophies awarded in 18 classes, and 3 special awards given for best Preservation, Diamond in the Rough, and Custom/ Modified. Our great team of volunteers kept things humming, DJ Rich Canfield kept the British Invasion mood alive, and we had convenient pub fare from 8 AM - 4 PM in the then-new Woody's biergarten. The weather cooperated that day, too, bringing in a decent crowd of spectators, considering we weren't in downtown Ocean Grove.

One huge change, as depicted in some of these photos, was the wearing of protective masks – even outdoors – during those most uncertain times of highly contagious viral transmission. Even our goodie bag gift was a protective mask, featuring the Union Jack and our PEDC logo.

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
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
