

This Year's Best of Britian theme at the Simeone Foundation Automotive Museum was "British V8 power." Twelve members of PEDC and a brother-in-law drove to south Philadelphia to view this year's exhibit on Saturday, 10 February. Despite the fact that it was mid-February, we had six cars including two late model Jaguars and an MGA on the drive. Russ Sharples in his red 1960 MGA was cut out of the line to be photographed and interviewed by Simeone Staff.

If you have not visited the Simeone Museum, it is worth the trip to south Philadelphia. It's not a Mister Roberts neighborhood but there is onsite parking and the museum is open Tuesday to Sunday. Once inside we were treated Britian's to many examples of British Sports cars with Factory V8 powered engines, as shown below.



1990 TVR Griffith 500. weighing 2400 lbs., it is powered by 5-liter version of the Rover V8. This incredibly fast car was never officially imported into the US.



1980 Aston Martin V8 Vantage. In 1967, Aston Martin unveiled the DBS with a 4-liter DOHC straight 6 from the DB6. When the 5.3-liter V8 was available in 1969, the DBS V8 was produced through 1989. This is the more powerful Vantage version.

1976 MGB GT V8. MG produced 2,591 MGB GTs from 1973 to 1976 with Rover V8 power. All but 11 were RHD and none were officially exported.



Another familiar car to the PEDC group is the 1972 Morgan Plus 8. Morgan Adopter Rover's 161 Hp V8. 6000 Plus 8s were produced before ceasing production in 2004.

1967 TVR Tuscan V8 SWB. TVR combined a tube chassis, independent suspension, and a light fiberglass body, with a Ford V8 engine. This version is only one of 28 short wheelbase Tuscan V8s



Another familiar car is this 1966 Sunbeam Tiger, Mk 1A. The Sunbeam Tiger replaced a heavy 4-cyl with a light V8, similar to the AC Cobra. This Tiger is one of approximately 2700 Mk 1A cars with the body and Trim found on the Series V Alpine.


The 1664 A.C. Cobra is probably the most famous British Sports Car. Most Cobras were built in England and shipped to California for Ford engine installation. However, the "COX" prefix on this car's serial Number indicates that it was a LHD export car fully finished at A.C. before being shipped to Canada.



1953 Allard J2X. Between 1952 and 1954, rally and time trials turned constructor, Syndney Allard, built 83 J2Xsports racing cars. The fast J2X featured independent front suspension with a de Dion rear suspension. A variety of American V8s were fitted, this one having a Cadilac 331 cid engine.

The Story of Our Cars....

This month we feature PEDC member, Richard Rosenthal's Spitfire!

The story of my Spitfire dates back to 1969, when I became enamored with my brother's Triumph TR3-A. When I finally graduated from college in 1973, I rewarded myself with a 1957 MGA. The lack of garage space and my inability to overcome the constant electrical problems imposed by Lucas, led me to reluctantly sell it. Unable to shake my love for LBCs (little British cars for the uninitiated), I jumped at the chance to buy a freshly painted 1971 Spitfire in top running order and with a new transmission. By now, I had a house with a 1-car garage to accommodate my new wheels. That was 38 years ago.

In 1990, while in the process of moving to our current residence, a garage full of boxes exiled the Spitfire to the driveway. We eventually covered it in plastic, prompting my marginally clever neighbor to dub the Spitfire CIB (car in bag). Fortunately, our new home had a 2-car garage, where the Spitfire and his new rodent friends resided for 17 years. But



needing additional space, the Spitfire found its way back to the driveway where it languished as CIB for a second time. In September 2022, my neighbor noticed the Spitfire and told me about Positive Earth Drivers Club. I went online, joined immediately, and learned about Bob and the Garage Squad. Turns out to be the best move I ever made (other than marrying my wife!).



In early January 2023, the guys from PEDC removed the plastic shroud to inspect their new "project" and concluded that while the paint was still good, the mouse-ridden interior was a bit rough. However, within an hour they got it running and as it sounded pretty good, I was ready to take it for a long awaited spin. Nope. Our next move was to clear one of the garage bays for the Spitfire. The PEDC guys came over once a week for the next 6 months. After putting it on jack stands, they proceeded to remove the wheels, then the front end, then the trunk lid, and just about everything else.

All their efforts resulted in the complete transformation of the engine compartment (Bob and John), interior (Paul), and electrical and dashboard (Russ). But thanks to

me, their job was not quite finished. After one of the

sessions, I closed the garage door without noticing the light hanging from the garage door opener. Like a laser-guided missile, the light found and cracked the windscreen, with Bob coming to the rescue to reinstall the new one.

That's the story. I cannot not adequately express my appreciation to the Garage Squad at PEDC for their professionalism, persistence, and outstanding work. Without them, my Spitfire would be relegated to CIB status for another few decades!

Now the only thing left is to figure out how to get in and out of it!

We did some additional work on **Mark Wintjen's TR7**, but had a problem with the clutch fluid line, so still a couple of things to button up before driving season.

The January 28th visit to work on **John Quelch's Alpine** saw most members engaged in sanding/repairing body parts. Looked like a scene from a Jersey City body shop! Work included patching some holes in the body and test fit of the hard top. The car should be ready soon for its new paint job.









Mitch Friedman's MGB finally came home from the body shop, so we spent some time working on reinstalling the interior, changing fluids, and chasing down some electrical demons. Should finish up in March.

We did more work on **Phil Aronow's TR6**. We bled the brakes and clutch and removed a very low-hanging rear anti-sway bar. We also found that the car seemed to run best with the idle timing at 45 degrees BTDC (wow!) So the distributor was removed and sent out to be rebuilt. The carbs will also be rebuilt to make sure everything is ready for Phil's first LBC driving season.





For Sale: 1973 MGB-GT with Spares

Garage Squad Car STILL available! Catch it before it goes on ebay! We are moving and need to pass the car on to a new owner. The car was delivered from England to a dealer in Texas in 1973 and was later sold to a person in Oklahoma in 2001. In July 2007 it was purchased and shipped to New York City and was stored in Long Branch. I purchased it in September of 2008.

No rust, 34 years in West Texas and Oklahoma. Car was repainted in original factory Damask Red in 2001 and interior redone with new carpeting and upholstery in 2005. In 2006 a total engine rebuild with aluminum head, Weber carburetor, electronic ignition, Peco big bore header and exhaust. The following was done in 2007: modified Morspeed fiberglass "C" hood, new radiator, water pump, fan blade, Armstrong shock dampers on all four wheels, new rear leaf springs, new rear bushings, new clutch master and slave cylinder with a new hose.

In 2019 on Father's Day we attended the annual Spring Lake Heights car show and bar-b-que at the Johnson's. Afterwards we thanked our hosts and tried to leave for home. Car refused to start. Bob Canfield, John Quelch and a few other guys came to our aid. They tried everything, including swapping parts from Jack's GT, but nothing worked. Called Triple A and they towed our "LBC" home to our garage. The following weekend Bob Canfield came over and put in a new coil and the car started right up.

A few weeks later my brake warning light came on. I called Bob Canfield for a recommendation to take the car to a good repair shop. He said he and John Quelch would be back next weekend to take a look. I had no back brakes. So began the great rebuilding of my car by the Garage Squad.

Over the next few weeks the Grage Squad went over the entire car and they spent a considerable amount of time to make sure everything was done correctly. And I became very familiar with the Moss Motors parts catalog. I have so much respect and gratitude for the garage squad for how much they accomplished with my car. It's too much to list here but I have the documentation for all they did. They love what they do and it shows in their craftsmanship and their willingness to spend their time to help out fellow members of the club. We will no longer have our "LBC" but we will still be in the club and enjoy the great members we have come to know.


